**FROM THE BOARD  
THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I use the commuter rail to travel to and from work on the North Shore. One frequent traveling companion is a co-worker at my office, an elderly Israeli man. We share an interest in music and frequently talk about our latest passions. One day on the train last week I was working on some memorization of a piece in Hebrew for an upcoming concert. I showed my friend the sheet music thinking he would be interested. I got more than I bargained for. He hands the music back to me and starts singing it, including the words! He said the piece had been very popular in Israel, and you'd hear it everywhere for awhile – in the street, on the bus, etc. He sang it as a bouncy, joyous ditty. In the chorus we had been singing it as a slow, serious work of art (I think it's quite beautiful). Asking him about why the difference in what I had expected, he said the song was a happy one and expressed the joy of life. Not only that, he was friends with the man who wrote the lyrics, and that man was the most famous lyricist in Israel in recent years, becoming quite wealthy from his work. And the story went on about how that man had a brother who committed suicide over inability to pay his overwhelming debts. My friend continued to offer tidbits of information relative to these stories over the next several days.

What does that have to do with anything? The connections we make when we share and tell our stories can be quite powerful. We'll be trying to do more of that in a public way at our monthly member meetings. And we can do it ourselves in small groups with friends old and new. Open up and share. Ask questions. Sometimes the answers will surprise and delight you. Being open and sharing is a work-in-progress for me too. In my head I hear my mom echoing "I'm not dead yet. I learned something today!"

We have a lot of activities coming up in the next month or two. Details are elsewhere in this issue. I encourage you in particular to sign up for the Thanksgiving potluck. Come and share in food and story.

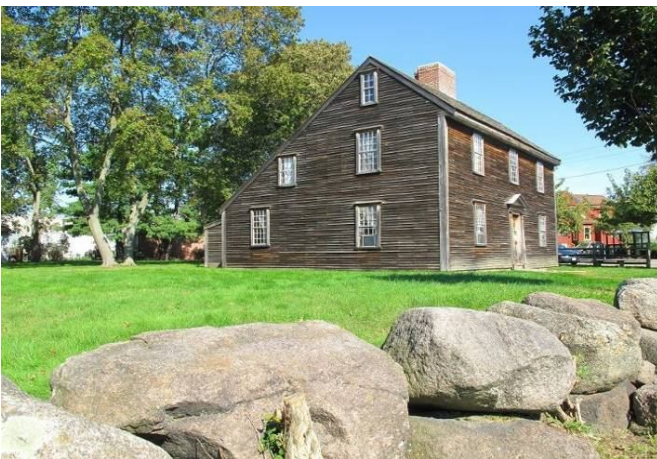
